

Despite the advances in Breast Cancer, the disparities among Black Women have widened.

The Disparities

Black women have the highest death rates. According to the most recent data available breast cancer deaths was 42% higher in Black women that white women between 2010 and 2014

Black women have the shortest survival rates than any other racial ethnic group. The overall 5 year survival rate for Black women diagnosed with breast cancer between 2007 and 2013 was 81% compared to 91% for white women.

From 2010-2014 (the most recent data), the incidence of breast cancer have increased slightly in Black women while they remained stable for white women and. Black women are more likely to get breast cancer at a younger age than white women. The median age of breast cancer diagnosis is 59 for Black women and 63 for white women. Black women under the age of 45 are more likely to get breast cancer than white women.

Why the Disparities

- Failure to get mammograms or other screenings as recommended. As a result, breast cancer is detected at a later stage when the cancer is more advanced.
- Lack of education or awareness of breast cancer risks and screening methods.
- Lack of or unequal access to care, including screenings and high quality treatment.
- 4. Black women are more likely to be diagnosed with a later stage and more aggressive breast cancer disease compared to other ethnic groups. These factors make it harder to treat.
